Now all men by these presents that we William Johnson and Patsy
of the County of Oglethorpe and state of Georgia for and in choice
of the sum of fifty dollars to us in hand paid the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged do bargain grant and sell unto Benjamin
Wrenn of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia all the
right title and claims that we now possess or ever did possess or
we will possess to a tract or parcel of land lying in said County of
Southampton and state of Virginia on the south side of the Keelson
swamp and bounded by the lands of Robert Nechylson Levi Rockells
Benjamin Belke of the lands of of said Wrenn who is now in possession
of the whole tract which he purchased of my Uncle Thomas Bellum
who with myself and others inherited it from my grandfather Tho Bellum
the elder with all the houses orchards mills stells and every thing there
containing to him and his heirs forever and we do moreover
warrant and defend the said right and title to the said Benjamin
from all claim or claims of any person or persons whatsoever
