by the said Thomas Gray at or before the sealing and delivery of these
presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and thereof and
of every part thereof doth acquit and discharge him the said Thomas
Gray his heirs executors administrators and assigns he the said Edwin
Gray hath granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed released &
confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien
enfeoff released and confirm unto him the said Thomas Gray
his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land situated
lying and being in the said County of Southampton whereon the said
Edwin Gray resides and adjoining the lands of Richard Blaw
John Mayhew and Thomas Esbey containing by a late survey made
by James Jones two hundred and seventy six acres be the same more
