This Indenture made this 9th day of January 1815 between Henry Senow and Fanny his wife of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the one part and William Ricks of the same County and state of the other part Witnesseth that the said Henry Senow and Fanny his wife for and in consideration of the just sum of eight hundred dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold and conveyed and doth by these presents grant bargain and sell unto the said William Ricks his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract piece and parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton which said land was sold by Benjamin Davis & Wife to Daniel Pond
