This Indenture made this first day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between Edwin Gray of the one part and John Marguhart of the said County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that the said Edwin Gray for and in consideration of the sum of eighteen hundred and six dollars to him in full satisfaction of the selling and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargain sold aliened conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien convey confirm and confirm into the said John Marguhart a certain tract or parcel of land being & lying Beginning at a sweet gum a new corner made in Thomas Gray's and standing in the Mile branch and pursuing the various courses of said branch to a white oak a corner of Thomas Gray thence to a post oak a corner of Thomas Gray thence to another post oak a corner of oak stump thence along the dividing line of Thomas & Edwin Gray formerly a white a corner formerly a lightwood post thence N. 68 W. 376 feet to a post oak thence along a line of marked trees on the side of the path to a gum thence to another gum thence to a poplar thence to a post oak thence to a Hickory thence to the beginning containing by survey three hundred and one acres The said tract or parcel of land being a part of the land whereon the said Edwin Gray now resides and which was devised to him by his father Edwin Gray To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with all houses woods waters ways profits and appurtenances of every kind to the same belonging to the said John Marguhart his heirs and assigns forever In witness whereof the said Edwin Gray and Margaret his wife have hereunto set their hands & seals the day & year first above written
