 before us in our County aforesaid and being examined by us privately
 apart from her husband and having the said deed read fully explained
 to her she the said Sarah Womblesse acknowledges that she hath
 in her act and deed and declared that she had willingly signed
 sealed and delivered the same and that she wished not to retract it

This Indenture and the Certificate of John Elgray &
 Samey Boykin magistrates of this County certifying the acknowledgment
 of Joseph I Womblesse and Sarah his wife parties hereto in pursuance of
 an act of assembly in such case made and provided and admitted to
 record the at a Court held for the said County of Southampton the
 17th day of June 1816 This Indenture and Certificate as aforesaid was entered
 upon the proceedings of the day - Teste James Rochelle

This Indenture made the fifteenth day of February in the year of our
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and six between Benjamin Devaney
 Dorothy his wife of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of
 the one part and Benjamin Story of the said County and state of the
 other part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Devaney and Dorothy
 his wife for and in consideration of the sum of seven hundred dollars
 then lawfully paid by the said Benjamin Story at or before the making
 and delivery of this presents the receipt whereof they the said Benjamin
 Devaney & Dorothy his wife doth hereby acknowledge hath bargained
 and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien convey
 unto him the said Benjamin Story one certain piece parcel & tract of
 land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton & Parish
 of Stollaway containing by survey two hundred and eighty nine acres
