Daniel Williams
July 3rd 1817

His Indenture made this 21st day of February in the year of our
Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and sixteen between William Williams
and Lydia Williams his wife both of the County of Southampton Spanish
of statutory of the one part and Daniel Williams their son of the
same County and parish of the other part Witnesseth that the said
William Williams and Lydia his wife for divers good causes and
respect that they bear towards their son Daniel and more especially
for the consideration of the sum of ten dollars to them in hand
paid by the said Daniel Williams the receipt whereof the said William
Williams and Lydia his wife doth acknowledge themselves fully &
amply satisfied and paid hath granted bargain given aliened & con-
veyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain
and convey the said Daniel Williams his heirs and assigns forever
and his heirs and assigns of land and premises to him and his heirs
forever situate lying and being in the County Spanish afore-
said and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a white oak at a new
corner made in William Williams line running thence S 80 W 96
pole to a sweet gum a new corner made in William Williams's
line standing on the side of a small branch thence S 70 W 48 pole
along a line of marked trees to variation on the line thence N 41 W
18 pole to a pine a corner in Sally Williams line on the side of the same
branch, thence N 17 W 160 pole to a pine a corner of Thomas Jones
thence N 75 East 52 pole to a pine a corner in William Williams old
line thence N 5 W 80 pole to a pine a corner of the land William Williams
purchased of James Williams being a part of the land laid off
to the said James Williams in the division of the lands of his dec^d father
standing on the branch called the Myry Branch thence down the various
courses of the said branch to a small branch near the path leading
to John Davis thence along the various courses of that branch to the head
of it and from the head of the said branch to the white oak or the first
station containing by a late survey made by the County surveyor 212
acres the same more or less together with all houses and houses & offices
buildings & gardens orchards ways waters and water courses whatsoever
belonging or in any wise appertaining to the said tract or parcel of
land and premises To have and to hold the same to the only proper
use and behoof of him the said Daniel Williams and to his heirs &
the said William Williams and Lydia his wife for themselves their heirs
executors administrators and assigns that they will by these presents forever
warrant and defend the right and title to the said lands unto the said
Daniel Williams and his heirs against the right title claim or demand
of any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part
or parcel thereof In Witness whereof the said William Williams and
Lydia his wife hath hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals
