The Commonwealth of Virginia to Robert Thompson
 Napley Webb and John Thompson gentlemen justices of the peace for the
 County of Norfolk greeting whereas Spencer Pierce and Emily his wife by their
 certain indenture of bargain and sale bearing date the 21st day of May
 1816 have sold and conveyed unto Richard Murfee of the County of Southampton
 one hundred and sixth part of a tract of land lying in the County of Southampton
 called and known by the name of Little town in the whole 800 acres of land
 more or less with the appurtenances lying and being in the County of
 Southampton and whereas the said Emily Pierce cannot conveniently
 travel to our County Court of Southampton to make acknowledgment
 of the said conveyance. Therefore we do give to you or any two or more
 of you power to receive the acknowledgment which the said Emily Pierce
 shall be willing to make before you of the conveyance aforesaid
 contained in the said indenture which is hereto annexed and we do
 therefore command you that you do personally go to the said Emily Pierce
 and receive her acknowledgment of the same and examine her privately
 and apart from the said Spencer Pierce her husband whether she doth
 the same freely and voluntarily without his persuasion or threats and whether
 she be willing that the same shall be recorded in our County Court of
 Southampton aforesaid and when you have received her acknowledgment
 and examined her as aforesaid that you do distinctly and openly certify
 us thereof in our said County Court under your seals sending them there
 the said indenture and this writ Witness James Rochelle Clerk of
 our said Court at his office the 25th day of May 1816 and 40th year
 of the Commonwealth

By Virtue of the within writs given to us directed we did personally
 examine her privately and apart from her husband and before us she
 did acknowledge the indenture hereunto annexed to be her act & deed
 and did declare that she did the same freely and voluntarily and
 without the persuasions or threats of her said husband and that she
 was willing the same should be recorded in the County Court of
