Whereas by a marriage agreement entered into between I John Ugubart and Betsey Dellard before the solemnization of the marriage and which may be found in the Court of the same County I John Ugubart was jointly and severally trustee of the property mentioned and conveyed to me in the said agreement and object of the said agreement and whereas the said Betsey Dellard at her pleasure during the continuance and whereas I am directed by the said property as an aforesaid conveyed to me to any person to whom she might dispose of the said property and whereas she has by her act of bargain and sale executed to Richmond Dellard bearing date the twentyfifth day of May 1816 sold a part of the property as aforesaid conveyed to me to the said Richmond Dellard the following slaves Bridget Harriet Lavina Rhodrick and also one four wheel carriage and two grey horses now therefore I know all men by these presents that I John Ugubart by virtue and in pursuance of power vested in me by the aforesaid marriage agreement have conveyed made over released and confirmed to the said Richmond Dellard and by these presents do make over convey release and confirm to the said Richmond Dellard all the right title and interest which as trustee as aforesaid I have in and to the said slaves Rhodrick Bridget Harriet Lavina and also one four wheel carriage and two grey horses to the said Richmond Dellard his heirs and assigns forever In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my name and affixed my seal the 3^d day of June in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixteen
