This Indenture made this 8th day of November in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen between John Fitch John Cochran Henry Welch James Tregant and John Scott the present trustees of Jerusalem of the one part and Henry Briggs of the other part Witnesseth that whereas an act of the general assembly of Virginia passed December the seventh one thousand seven hundred and ninety one entitled an act to establish lot and town and for other purposes which enact that ten acres of land adjoining the courthouse in the County of Southampton the property of Joseph and William Scott should be and was thereby vested in Edwin Gray James Melkerson Samuel Miller Benjamin Clark Thomas Reddy Benjamin Griffin Robert Goddard and John Taylor trustees to lay them or a majority of them down into lots of half an acre each with convenient streets and establish a town by the name of Jerusalem and whereas the said act did further enact that the said trustees or a majority of them should provide to all the said
