This Indenture made and entered into this 5th day of May in the year of our lord eighteen hundred and sixteen between Miles Everett and Temperance Everett his wife of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the one part and Esom Everett of the same County and state of the other part Witnesseth that the said Miles Everett and Temperance his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and seventeenth dollars to them in hand paid by the aforesaid Esom Everett at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold unto the said Esom Everett and by these presents do and each of us bargain and sell unto the said Esom Everett his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County and state and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a post set up on Eden and Drews line a corner of John Partridge line to a oak a corner between said Miles Everett and Martha Everett thence nearly West course along said Martha Everett line of marked trees to said Eden and Drews line thence along said Drews line to the beginning which said lines contain one third part of the land formerly owned by Thomas Everett dec^d say thirty more acres be the same more or less together with all its commodities advantages emoluments hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or appertaining and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders hereto thereto therof to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and every part thereof unto the said Esom Everett his heirs and assigns forever to him for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Esom Everett his heirs and assigns forever and the said Miles Everett and Temperance his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract or parcel of land with the
