This Indenture

July one thousand eight hundred and sixteen between Edward Rogers of
Westbrook and David Myrick Commissioner appointed by the County Court
of Southampton agreeable to a decretal order made September Court 1816
as reference to the decree had well more fully appear of the one part and
Arthur Wellmanson of the other part Wellmanson that the said Commissioner
above named for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and twenty
five dollars and eighteen cents in hand to them the said Commissioner paid
the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and
sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Arthur
Wellmanson his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract piece or parcels of land
lying on the South side of the three creeks in the aforesaid County of
Southampton containing twenty four acres be the same more or less
and bounded as follows Beginning at a Locust tree in the old field there is N 69
E 58 pole to a maple in a branch thence down the branch to a sweet
gum ^{in a line} thence N 38 W 39 pole to a maple thence N 28 W 14 pole to a
oak thence N 16 W 34 pole to an elm on the three creeks thence up the
said creeks to a sweet gum on the back run thence up the S 3 E 19 pole
to a white oak thence S 19 E 34 pole to the beginning including the land
belonging to John Rivers dec^d also one other tract or parcel of land containing
by survey thirty nine acres be the same more or less lying and being on the
South side of the three creeks in the aforesaid County and bounded as follows
beginning at a black oak in Thorpe's line N 58 W 56 pole to a black gum
thence N 25 W 14 7 pole to a persimmon on the run of the three creeks
thence up the various courses of said creek to the fork thence down the
various courses of the back run to Edwin Bassett's line thence S 19 E 89 pole
to a sweet gum thence S 24 pole to an over kept tree thence S 3 E 18 pole
to an elm thence S 55 W 9 poles to an ash thence S 35 E 18 poles to a
willow in a branch thence up said branch to the head to a pine thence
N 73 E 13 poles to the beginning being the land belonging to Nancy Rivers
dec^d which she bot of Joshua Gibbs also one other tract or parcel of land
which the said Nancy Rivers bought of Lucy Long lying and being in the
aforesaid County of Southampton containing by stated survey forty acres
and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a lightwood post in a line of
Burgess's Pasture thence N 29 E 8 1/2 pole to a red oak thence N 15
W 29 pole to a pine thence N 28 W 14 pole to a lightwood post
thence S 66 E 29 1/4 poles to a pine thence along a line of run
