This Indenture made this 7th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen between Nathaniel Boush and Sarah Eliza his wife of Norfolk Borough and state of Virginia of the one part and James Millar of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Nathaniel Boush and Sarah Eliza his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to him in hand paid by the said James Millar the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargain sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell aliened and confirm unto the said James Millar his heirs and assigns forever one tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less and is a part of the land purchased of the said James Millar and bounded as follows beginning at a black gum standing in the long branch a corner of Camp and Millars land and run and aft two in Bush line thence up the line of said branch to a pine in the fork of said branch thence by a line of marked trees through the low grounds East southerly to a embell corner pine standing on the edge of the old field thence by a line of marked trees East southerly to the edge of the old field and by a line of marked trees East southerly until it intersects the line dividing the lands of Thomas Vaughan and Sampson Pope thence along the said line of Thomas Vaughan and between said Boush and Sampson Pope and Thomas Vaughan
