 hereby granted, with all its appurtenances, unto the said John V. Rich-

 and every other person or persons, claiming under him, and shall and
 will forever warrant and defend by these presents.

This Indenture, made and entered into, on this
 1st day of March in year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
 18th, between the said Benjamin Blunt and between James Rochelle and James Edwards, of the County
 of Southampton, in the State of Virginia, of the one part, and Lewis A.
 Packham of the County of Brunswick, in the same State of the other part
 whereas by a decree of the Chancery district Court of Williamsburg, prom-
 ounced on the 23rd day of October 1813. in a suit depending therein, between
 the said Lewis A. Packham and Martha Louisa his wife late Martha
 Louisa Baker, plaintiffs, against James Goodman, Sheriff of the County
 of Nanamond, and other defendants, the said James Rochelle and James
 Edwards are appointed, together with others named in the said decree, com-
 missioners, and two of them, and authorized and requested by the said
 decree, to expose to public sale, two equal undivided third parts of, and
 in a certain tract or parcel of Land and plantation in the said Coun-
 ty of Southampton, called the Tallarney containing, by estimation eight
 hundred acres, and whereas the said James Rochelle and James Edwards
 two of the Commissioners, named in the said decree, did, in manner and
