 tween Almer Kincaid & Elizabeth Kincaid his wife of the County
 of Southampton & State of Virginia of the one part and Merit
 Harris of the aforesaid County & State of the other part. Witnesseth
 that the said Almer Kincaid & Elizabeth his wife for and in Consi-
 deration of the sum of One hundred & forty four dollars to him in
 hand paid on or before the making & signing of these presents the
 receipt whereof the said Almer Kincaid & Elizabeth Kincaid his
 wife doth hereby acknowledge, have granted bargained and sold
 aliened and confirmed unto the said Merit Harris his heirs and
 assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of Land containing forty
 four acres and bounded as follows to wit, Beginning at a small
 scrub Oak on the side of the Road in William Norton's line
 running thence South 33 degrees West 20 poles thence South 32 de-
 grees West thirty poles thence South forty three degrees West forty poles
 thence South fifty two degrees West fifty poles being the various
 corners of the said road, to a pine stump in Merit Harris's line then
 North thirty five degrees West forty five poles to a pine corner
 of Bailey & Barnard's land thence North fifty degrees East ten
 poles to the sixty degrees East twenty four poles thence North
 thirty seven degrees East twenty seven poles to a small black
 gum in a corner of William Norton's line thence South seventy nine
 degrees East fifty six poles to the first station containing forty
 four acres and more or less to have and to hold the said forty
 four acres Land with all singulars and appurtenances therunto
