This Indenture, made this twenty five
 day of April in the year eighteen hundred and seventeen between
 Tregant Martha R. Baylot of Town of Suffolk in the County of
 Nanamoud of the first part and James Tregant of the County
 of Southampton of the second part witnesseth that the said
 Martha R. Baylot for and in Consideration of the sum of
 five hundred and nineteen dollars and fifty Cents, to her herein
 paid at and before the making and delivery of these presents the
 receipt whereof the said Martha R. Baylot hath hereby acknowledged
 (the) and have acquit and discharged the said James Tregant
 with, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and
 by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey and confirm
 unto the said James Tregant his heirs and assigns forever and certain
 tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of South-
 ampton, in the parish of St. Luke, on the south side of
 Hatteras River, containing Two hundred and ninety one acres
 being the same which was allotted to the said Martha Baylot as her
 portion of the Land of which her father Jeremiah Baylot
 died seized and possessed in the said County of Southampton
 by a decree of the Worshipful Court of Southampton County, and
 bounded as follows to wit, beginning at Hooker tree a new corner
 made in the old Indian line, and also in the corner right of
 Mrs. Mily Hanning near John Crocker house, thence running
 North 78 East 23 poles to a red oak a new corner made in
 Edward Reddicks lot No 2. And in the corner line of John Mils
 also thence along the dividing line of lots No 1 and 2 North
 12 degrees East 150 poles, to a white oak a corner of the Land
 late of the Land of William Blom standing in a small branch
 thence along that branch the various Courses thereof to a street
 now a corner in the Land lately belonging to William Blom, but
 now owned by the above mentioned James Tregant standing near
 his house, and on the North side of the said branch, thence
