and we do therefore command you, that you do perso-
nally go to the said Sophia J. and receive her acknow-
ledgment of the same, and examine her privately and
apart from the said Henry Welsh, her husband, whether
she doth the same freely and voluntarily, within his per-
suasion or threats, and whether she be willing that the
same shall be recorded in the County Court of Southamp-
ton aforesaid; and when you have received her acknow-
ledgment, and examined her as aforesaid, that you distinctly
