Ossin Ricks of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, having under my hand a negro man named Moses, aged about twenty five years, whom I have heretofore held as a slave, being of opinion that it is my duty to do by virtue, as I would be done by the Lord I do hereby emancipate and set free the said Moses and I do for myself my heirs, executors and administrators hereby relinquish all my right, title, interest and claim or pretensions of claim whatsoever either to his person or to any estate he may hereafter acquire, the above named Moses and his posterity to enjoy their full freedom without any interruption from me, or any person claiming for, by or under me. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 12th day of July, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and seventeen
