This Indenture with the certificate thereon endorsed, duly

within conveyance, was returned and admitted to record  
And at a Court held for the said County of Southampton  
the 16<sup>th</sup> day June 1817. This Indenture as aforesaid was

This Indenture, made this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of  
April, one thousand eight hundred & seventeen, between  
Mary Wormack of Southampton County, State of Virginia  
of the one part, & John Wormack of the same County and State  
of the other part, witnesseth, that the said Mary Wormack for  
and in consideration of the sum of one dollar & no more  
in hand paid, & also for the further consideration of the natural  
love and affection which I bear to and the said John Wormack  
have given, granted, bargained and sold & by these presents do  
give, grant & relinquish all my right and title unto him the  
said John Wormack, his heirs & assigns forever, in a certain tract or  
parcel of land, lying and being in the County of Southampton  
Va. (but aiming) by estimation, one hundred and twenty acres  
more or less, and bounded as follows (Vizt.) Beginning at  
Joseph Summers line, near the lower corner of the place, in the  
place where the s<sup>d</sup> Mary Wormack now lives, thence taking the  
path as the fence now runs up into the road to Benjamin  
Blunts line, thence down the s<sup>d</sup> line to the Causeway for and  
joining S. David Stemons line, thence up the Causeway branch  
to Joseph Summers line, thence up the s<sup>d</sup> line to the first station  
As reference to a former deed given to the said John Wormack  
by his father James B. Wormack dec<sup>d</sup> for the above mentioned land  
bearing date the 26<sup>th</sup> day of February and thousand eight  
hundred & fourteen, fourteen, will more fully appear. Do  
have and do hold the s<sup>d</sup> land and premises unto him the said  
John Wormack his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim  
or claims of her the s<sup>d</sup> Mary Wormack her heirs, Executors, &  
assigns, and against the claim or claims of all and every person  
or persons whatsoever, she all with and do warrant, and do  
defend by these presents, In witness whereof I have hereunto  
my hand and affixed my seal the day and date first  
being written.
