of September, in the year of our Lord Christ, one thousand
eight hundred and nineteenth, by and between William F. White
and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Brunswick and State
of Virginia of the one part, and Henry Vaughan of South
ampton County Virginia of the other part: Witnesseth, that
they the said William F. White and Elizabeth his wife for
and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and
forty dollars, to them in hand paid at and before the
making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged, they the said William F. White and
Elizabeth his wife for themselves their heirs, executors, administra-
tors, heirs, assigns, bargain, sell, alien and confirm
and by these presents bargain, sell, alien and confirm
unto him the said Henry Vaughan his heirs and assigns
forever, and unto his heirs and assigns forever, all that certain
parcel of land lying and being
situate in the aforesaid County of Southampton, on the
North side of Mattoway River, containing (a greater or less
survey of the same, lately made by James Jones Esquire) Eighty
and four acres as follows, To wit: Beginning at a black gum
in Mrs. Creech's line, Running thence N 85° W 12 pole to a pine
a corner of Mrs. Creech's, thence S 35° W 30 pole to a pine a corner
of Mrs. Creech's, thence S 43° E 26 pole, thence S 28° E 94 pole
to a pine (a variation) thence S 72° E 20 pole, thence S 33° E
20 pole, thence S 45° E 32 pole to a small black gum a corner
of The Brick bolls and James Gussmit, thence N 73° E
