 his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia
 and Jaqueline Peterson and Eliza his wife of Hancock
 County and State of Georgia, and Peter Blom of the County
 of Southampton; Witnesseth, that the said Thomas Fitzhugh
 and Nancy his wife, and Jaqueline Peterson and Eliza his
 wife for and in consideration of the sum of twenty two pounds
 nineteen shillings and nine pence Virginia currency to them
 in hand paid by the said Peter Blom, the receipt whereof
 they the said Thomas Fitzhugh and Nancy his wife, and Jaqueline
 Peterson and Eliza his wife do hereby acknowledge, have granted
 bargained and sold, aliened and confirmed, and by these presents
 do grant, bargain, sell, alien and confirm unto the said Peter
 Blom his heirs and assigns forever all their right, title and
 interest in and to Twenty acres of land, be the same more or
 less, lying and being on the North side of the road leading
 from Belfield to Bethlehem and to Surabins, and joining
