Sister Darden
April 8th 1824

Know all men by these presents, that I, Jacob Darden of Southampton County Virginia, for and in consideration of the paternal love and affection, which I have and bear for and towards my said Sister Darden, and in consideration of one dollar to me in hand paid by (my said Sister Darden, at and before the executing and delivery of these presents; I the said Jacob Darden have given, granted, sold and confirmed unto the said Sister Darden, and by these presents for myself, my heirs, executors and administrators to give, grant, sell and convey unto him the said Sister Darden and his heirs and assigns forever, the several parcels of land and interest here and there and the said Negro Girl I have named Marinda, now in his possession (and for which the space of five years, which is recorded in the County Court of Southampton, and which is intended to be superseded by this present Deed of gift or Bill of Sale) to have and to hold the said Negro girl Marinda with all her increase to him the said Sister Darden his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I the said Jacob Darden have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2nd day of November 1817.
