 do hereby certify that Priscilla Piers the Wife of Nathl. Piers
 parties to the within Indenture for the conveyance of an estate
 to Peter P. Piers bearing date the 27th day of December 1816
 personally appeared before us in our County aforesaid, and
 being examined by us privately and apart from her said husband
 and having the said indenture fully explained to her the
 said Priscilla Piers, acknowledged the same to be her act
 and deed, and declared that she had willingly signed
 sealed and delivered the same, and that she wished not
 to retract it. Given under our hands and seals this 20th day
 of Novr 1817.

 for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and Sixty Dollars
 in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said
 Sinclair Joyner & Amelia his wife, have granted, bargained and
 sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the
 said John More his heirs and assigns forever all that messuage
 or tenement wheres the said Sinclair Joyner & Amelia his wife, now being
 which said messuage or tenement was devised to the said Amelia, formerly
 Amelia Barnes, by her father Jacob Barnes dec'd. last Will Testaments
 referenced had thereto it well fully appears, containing Sixty two acres
 and adjoining the lands of Martha Barnes, Pegg Willford,
 formerly Pegg Barnes, Benjamin Story formerly Benj. Swaney &
 the lands of the said John More; and also all trees, woods, ways,
