Lore being examined by us privately and apart from her husband
and having the Deed aforesaid fully explained to her the said
Charlotte Lore acknowledged the same to be her hand and seal, act
and deed, and declared that she had willingly assigned, sealed
declared the same, and the aforesaid Mrs. Lore also appeared before us
and acknowledged the within Indenture to be their hand and seal
act and deed, and that they wished not to retract it. Given under
our hand and seals this 23rd day of December 1817.

to him in hand paid, by the said William Bailey, the receipt
whereof the said Samuel Hart stands hereby acknowledged, the said
Samuel Hart hath granted, bargained and sold, aliened, conveyed
and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell, alien,
convey and confirm unto the said William Bailey, his heirs and assigns
forever, all that the said Samuel Hart inherit by virtue of his father
Jesse Hart's last Will & Testament to a certain tract or parcel of land
containing one hundred acres more or less, lying in the County of Southampton
of said, being the land which on my father Jesse Hart's
last Will & Testament was devised to my brother William Hart under certain
circumstances & by him sold to the said William Bailey & a deed of
conveyance granted, reference being had to the Will will more fully
appear. To have and to hold all and singular the said premises
