ninth day of November, the 18th year of our Lord, One thousand
eight hundred & seventeen, Between William & Mrs. Brown of
this side of the County of Southampton of the one part, & William
Nicholson of the same County of the other part, Witnesses, That the said William
& Mrs. Brown for and in consideration of the sum of
£100 Thous and five hundred & no dollars, current money of North Carolina
then & paid by the said William Nicholson or on before the making
& delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof the said William
& Mrs. Brown & their wife & co. hereby acknowledged, have bar-
gained & sold & by these presents do each of them & each bargain
sell unto the said William Nicholson this City & appurtenances all
that tract or parcel of land, situated lying & being in the County
of Southampton, generally known by the name of Springfield & also
of eight hundred & fifty acres, bounded and more or less, and
including therein a water grist mill situated on the Buckhorn
resamp and bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at the mouth
of the Buckhorn resamp. at a corner in the name of Betty Hughes &
