This Indenture on a do this Twenty
 sixth day of February one thousand eight hundred & eight and
 between Benjamin Bark and Fanny Bark and his wife of the first
 part & Nathaniel Simmons of the second part, all of the County of
 Southampton & State of Virginia, Witnesses, that the said
 Benjamin Bark and Fanny his wife for & in consideration
 of the sum of one thousand eight hundred dollars to them in
 hand paid by the said Nathaniel Simmons at & before the sealing
 & delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknow-
 ledged, have granted, bargained & sold, and by these presents
 do grant, bargain, sell, release, ratify & confirm unto him the
 said Nathaniel Simmons this their forever, one certain tract
 or parcel of land, situated lying & being in the County of
 Southampton, bounded as follows to wit, Beginning at
 Willow oak a corner of James Millers line standing near the
 side of Buckhorn swamp, thence down the said Swamp the
 various courses thereof to a dogwood in Doct. Saml. Blunt's line
 near a spring, thence S 45° 16' 39" E to a large red oak
 a corner of Doct. Saml. Blunt, thence S 72° 10' 56" E to a
 lightwood stump a corner of Doct. Saml. Blunt, thence N 4°
 32' 21" E to the mouth of the Cabin Branch, thence S 43° 16'
 24" E, thence S 54° 16' 74" E, thence S 49° 10' 28" E to the
 mouth of the east spring of Cabin Branch, thence S 35° E 42'
 E to the west corner in Drury Wallers line, then in
 the east spring of the Cabin Branch, thence S 48° E 118' E to
 a small oak bush, a corner of Drury Wallers line, thence S 16°
 E 51' E to a black Jack oak, a corner of Drury Wallers
 line, thence S 14° E 73' E to a large spring, a corner of Drury
 Wallers, thence S 14° 9' E 150' E to a large red oak in Drury
