 Between said Barr Boren of Southampton County of the one part, and
 Zachariah Lankford of the same County of the other part, witness
 that at the said Barr Boren by virtue of a deed in trust ex-
 ecuted to him by Stephen Lankford dec'd for certain purposes
 therein mentioned, and recorded in the County Court of Southampton
 and after having given legal notice, he at this day sold at public
 sale unto the said Zachariah Lankford for the sum of one
 hundred and thirty two dollars and seventy five cents good Spanish
 money, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and that tract
 and parcel of land whereof the said Stephen Lankford dec'd says
 he possessed lying in the County of Southampton and containing forty
 acres of the same more or less, as follows to wit: (to wit)
