Collier before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas R. Collier his heirs and assigns forever all that well known tract or parcel of Lands and plantation called and known by the name of the Crop Ridge lying and being in the said county of Southampton and containing by estimation three hundred acres to the more or less together with all and singular the appurtenances therunto in anywise belonging. To have and to hold the said Lands and appurtenances therunto belonging to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Thomas R. Collier his heirs and assigns forever and the said Benjamin Wilmston for himself his heirs executors and administrators the right and title to the aforesaid premises unto the said Thomas R. Collier his heirs and assigns forever against the claim of himself or against the claim or claims of any other person whatsoever shall and will forever hereafter defend by these presents.
