Collier his heirs and assigns forever, all that well known tract or parcel of Land, in plantation called and known by the name of the Cope Holes lying and being in the said county of Southampton and containing by estimation three hundred acres to the same more or less, together with all and singular the appurtenances therunto belonging To have and to hold the said Land and appurtenances therunto belonging, to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Thomas R. Collier his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Benjamin W. Johnston for himself his heirs executors, administrators &c the right and title to the aforesaid premises unto the said Thomas R. Collier his heirs and assigns forever against the claim of himself or against the claim or claims of any other person whatsoever shall and will forever warrant defend by these presents.
