Companions This Indenture made this 10th day of November in the year of
 our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and seventeen. Between
 P. Clements, Robert Nicholas of Randolph Newsum, commissioners
 appointed by the County court of Southampton to make sale of the lands
 of Drury Parker late all of the County of Hampton and parish
 of Saint Luke of the one part, and Matthew Parker of the same
 County and parish of the other part. Witnesses that the said
 Robt. P. Clements, Robert Nicholas and Randolph Newsum for and
 in consideration of the sum of nineteen hundred and fifty dollars
 current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Matthew
 Parker both by grant, bargain, sale, alien, in fee and otherwise
 and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said
 Matthew Parker to him and to his heirs forever on certain tract
 or parcel of land and premises, situated lying and being in the
 County and parish aforesaid containing by a late survey made
 by the County Surveyor of Four hundred and seventy two acres
 be the same more or less and bounded as follows (to wit) beginning
 at a highway a or Mr. Markes land thence N. 5. E. 112 poles to the
 Mount Swamp thence along that swamp the various courses thence
 to a small tract, thence N. 70. W. 20 poles thence S. 40. W. 40 poles
 to a fore and aft pine, thence S. 55. W. 16 poles to a large pine
 be of Benj. Blount thence S. 15. E. 182 poles to a maple tree of
 thence N. 11. E. 40 poles where we calculate the wood land and thence
 S. 15. E. 100 poles to a pine variation thence S. 87. E. 102 poles
 to a red oak corner of the estate of Drury Parker and John
 W. Jiller thence one South 66 poles to a red oak corner of John W.
 Jiller and Henry Barrows estate lands thence N. 81. E. 112 to the first of Ben
 Jiller thence with all housing out houses, cellars, buildings, yards
 gardens, orchards, ways, waters and water courses whatsoever lying and
 any wise appurtenances unto the said tract or parcel of land and
 premises. To have and to hold the same unto the said
 Matthew Parker to him and to his heirs forever and the said
 Richard P. Clements, Robert Nicholas and Randolph Newsum
 for themselves their heirs &c. as commissioners doth covenant
