This Indenture made and entered into on this 3rd day of October
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteenth by and
 between William G Briggs and Mary Briggs his wife of the one part & Euseb
 Eversitt of the second and part part all the above named parties heirs of the County
 of Southampton in the State of Virginia now this Indenture witnesseth
 that the said William G Briggs and Mary his wife have for and are
 in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to them in hand
 paid by the said Euseb Eversitt at or before the making and delivery of
 these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained
 and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain & sell unto
 the said Euseb Eversitt his heirs and assigns forever a certain parcel
 or lot of land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton
 and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a black gum standing
 in a branch called the meadow branch thence up the said branch
 it being Jacob Briggs line also to another black gum a corner of
 the land formerly Ethelred Dews, thence nearly a south course
 along said Dews line of marked trees to a post set up in said line
 thence nearly a east course to a trail line of marked trees to said
 Euseb Eversitt line to a post set up in said line thence nearly a
