This Indenture made and entered into this 15th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteenth by and between William Whitfield of the first part, and John E. Martin of the other part both of the said parties heirs of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said William Whitfield for and in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred Dollars to him in hand paid by the said John E. Martin at or before the enrolling and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said John E. Martin his heirs and assigns forever, one certain part of the land given by Deed and also bequeathed by the last will & testament of Andrew Whitfield dead of the said County and State to the said William Whitfield the said land being and lying in the aforesaid County and State, say one hundred acres and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at William Bryant and Thomas Barnes's corner tree, say of the land Thomas Barnes lately purchased of Adolphus Whitehead thence along said Barnes's line to Jordan Barnett's line thence along Jordan Barnett's line to said Thomas Barnes's line of the land whereon Thomas Barnes now lives thence along said Barnes's line to Benjamin Barnes's line thence along Benjamin Barnes's line so far and no farther than by running
