This Indenture made this 19th day of Oct. in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and eighteen Between Tarleton W. Scott of the County
 of Southampton State of Va. of the one part, George Camp of the said County of
 Southampton and State of Va. of another part. Witnesseth that the said Tarleton W.
 Scott for and in consideration of the just and full sum of four Dollars current
 money of Virginia by the said George Camp to him in hand paid the receipt whereof
 in the said Tarleton W. Scott doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and
 discharge the said George Camp his heirs and assigns forever, doth himself therewith
 fully, entirely satisfied, contented and paid, and moreover unto the said Tarleton
 W. Scott has granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed, released and conveyed
 delivered, confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey,
 release and deliver and confirmed unto the said George Camp and to his heirs
 and assigns forever, all his right title, interest, claim or demand on a certain
 piece, parcel of land, situate lying and being in Southampton County
 aforesaid and bounded as follows. Beginning at a small pine a corner in
 George Camp's Tarleton W. Scott's line, thence along a South west Course a
 straight line to a Spanish oak a corner in Amos Saynas; James Scott's line
 thence a north west Course along a straight line of the said James
 Scott to a Lighthouse post a corner in Tarleton W. Scott and Matthew
 B. L. line, thence along the said Bales line to a pine at the road another
 corner in the said Bales and Tarleton W. Scott line, thence along a straight
 line between the aforesaid George Camp and Tarleton W. Scott to
 the beginning containing by estimation one and a half acres
 be the same more or less with all profits commodities hindrances
