 Daughtry Indenture

This Indenture

made and entered into this ninth day of December
 in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen Between William Bell of the
 County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part. William M. West
 of the County of Halifax and State of North Carolina of the second part and Mrs.
 Daughtry of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the third part.
 Witnesseth that whereas the said William Bell hath this day purchased of
 the above mentioned William M. West a tract or parcel of land lying being
 and situate in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia and hath
 recd to the said William M. West for the purchase of the same his five several
 bonds bearing even dates with these presents payable as follows First one payable
 the twenty fifth of December one thousand eight hundred and eighteen for the sum
 of two hundred Dollars, one payable the twenty fifth of December 1819
 one payable the twenty fifth of December 1820 and one payable the twenty fifth of
 December 1821 and one payable twenty fifth December 1822 for the sum of
 six hundred Dollars each and the said William Bell being willing and
 desirous of securing to the said William M. West the above mentioned sums
 as well as for the further consideration of one Dollar to him in hand paid by
 the said William M. Daughtry before the executing and delivery of these presents
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. That the said William M. Daughtry
 sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said
 Mrs. Daughtry one certain tract or parcel of land lying being & situate in
 the County of Southampton & State of Virginia it being the tract of land on
 which the said Bell now resides known by the name of "Hickup" and adjoining
 the lands of Robert Goodwyn, Kendall Schenckelshew and others (perhaps) and
 which land the said Bell has this day purchased of the said West containing
 by estimation four hundred and thirty nine acres more or less. To have and
 to hold the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular the appurtenances
 thereto belonging to the only proper use and behoof of them the said
 Mrs. Daughtry and heirs forever and the said William Bell for himself his heirs
 executors and assigns with the said Mrs. Daughtry her heirs executors and assigns the right and
 title to the said tract or parcel of land against the claims or claims of
 any person or persons whatsoever shall and will forever warrant and
 defend by the these presents. Upon Trust nevertheless it is the
