 hath granted the receipt whereof the said Miles Murfee and Lydia
 Murfee his wife doth acknowledge themselves satisfied and paid
 bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these
 presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said Edwin
 Bond his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel
 of land and premises situate, lying and being in the
 County of Southampton aforesaid on the west side of Masson-
 hump Mill containing by a late survey made by
 the County surveyor thereof acres, be the same more or
 less, and bounded as follows, (to wit) Beginning at a
 pine a new corner made in Elizabeth Turnstone
