This Indenture

Sheweth one the said eight hundred and sixteen day of
John Barnes and Cherry, wife of the County of Sanborn
one part and Bolling H. Barnes of the other part of the
15th. Feb. 1819 that the said John Barnes and Cherry his
wife for and in consideration of the sum of nine hundred
dollars to the said John Barnes for their heirs and
next heirs is lawfully acknowledged, have granted, conveyed
and sold and by these presents do grant convey and confirm
unto the said Bolling H. Barnes his heirs and assigns
Forever all that tract or parcel of land lying and being
situate on the South side of Stottaway river in the County of
Yorkhampton aforesaid, containing two hundred and thirty
acres by the same more or less. Bounded as follows. To wit
Beginning at a poplar in Duckwathunta Swamp in John
James line, thence along the said line to a pine in John
James line, thence along the said James line to a white oak
in Miller James line, thence along the said line to a pine in a
line of marked trees, which refer formerly as line between
the said John Barnes and Miller James, thence a north course
to the Forks in branch, thence down the said branch to
Duckwathunta Swamp, thence up the said Swamp to the
beginning. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of
land with all and singular the premises & appurtenances
thereto belonging for in any wise appurtenances unto
him the said Bolling H. Barnes his heirs and assigns Forever
And the said John Barnes Cherry his wife for themselves
their heirs and assigns doth covenant (and agree to &
with the said Bolling H. Barnes his heirs and assigns
to warrant and defend forever the title of the said premises
against the claim or demands of any person or persons
whatsoever in witness whereof the said John Barnes & Cherry
his wife have hereunto set their hands & seals the day of
year above written
