in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen Between
Francis Cotton of the County of Southampton of the one part and
Henry Applwhite of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that
the said Francis Cotton for and in consideration of the sum of two
hundred and eight dollars and fifty cents of lawful money of Virginia
to her in hand paid by the said Henry Applwhite at or before the
sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said
Francis Cotton doth hereby acknowledge and thereof says of every part
and parcel doth clearly, innocently acquit and discharge the
Henry Applwhite his heirs executors, administrators and assigns
and every of them forever by these presents she the said Francis Cotton
hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed and by
these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey and confirm
unto the said Henry Applwhite his heirs and assigns forever
a certain tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances situate
lying and being in the County of Southampton containing thirty two
acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit
Beginning at a pine a corner of H. S. P. Westbrook's line thence along
the said Westbrook's line to a post, thence a straight line nearly
an east course to a pine in Benjamin Applwhite's line thence along
the said Applwhite's line to a corner in my line thence along
my line to the beginning and the portion and portions remainder
and remnants of all land singular the said tract or parcel of land
and premises hereby granted or mentioned to be held together and
of every part and parcel thereof and all the usufructs, services and
profits be the same or any part or parcel thereof incident belonging or
appertaining and also all and every the estate and estate in the title
claims interest and demands whatsoever of her the said Francis Cotton
into or out of the said tract of land past, present and future thereof
to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and all other the
premises hereby granted, bargained and sold, and every part and parcel
thereof with their and every of their appurtenances unto the said
Henry Applwhite his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper
