This Indenture made this 5th day of Decr
 in the year of our Lord Christ 1818, between Joseph Worrell
 & Rhoda his wife of the County of Sampton & State of Virginia
 of the one part and Lewis Worrell of the same County and State
 of the other part Witnesseth that the said Joseph Worrell & Rhoda
 his wife for and in consideration of the sum of nine hundred &
 seventy five dollars to them in hand paid by the said Lewis
 Worrell (and Rhoda his wife doth hereby acknowledge and
 thereof acquit and discharge the said Lewis Worrell his heirs
 executors and assigns forever by these presents that the said
 Joseph Worrell (and Rhoda his wife) have granted, bargained
 sold, aliened released and confirmed and by these presents do grant
 sell, give, release and confirm unto the said Lewis Worrell and
 his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land
 lying and being in the above said County of Sampton and in
 the parish of Saint Luke, containing by a late survey one
 hundred and twenty two acres be the same more or less
 bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at a dead pine at
 in Thomas Johnson's line, standing on the side of the Chapel
 road, thence S 42° E 8 pole variation on the line thence S 52°
 E 20 pole on the same line, thence S 43° E 36 pole to a
 pine tree on the marked line, thence S 53° E 40 pole to a
