This Indenture

Made the 19th day of February in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and nineteen between William H. B. J. & Polly Rogers his wife of the County of Southampton and parish of Newton of the one part and Wm. Hatfield of the County of parish of Newton of the other part. It is shewn that the said William H. B. J. and Polly his wife for and in consideration of the full and just sum of fifty three dollars current money of Virginia the said Wm. Hatfield to them in hand paid of or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said William H. B. J. and Polly Rogers his wife doth hereby acknowledge and they acquit and discharge the said Wm. Hatfield her heirs and assigns forever, free themselves therewith fully and entirely satisfied, contented and paid, have granted, conveyed, sold, placed, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do grant, convey, sell, alien, convey and confirm unto and to the said Wm. Hatfield and to his heirs and assigns forever all that plantation messuage tract and parcel of land which he bought of Amos Rogers situate lying and being in the parish of Newton County of Southampton aforesaid, containing by estimation seventy one acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a red oak corner in Thomas Lipe thence along a line of marker trees a pine corner tree in Scotts line thence along a line of marker trees to the branch thence down the run of the branch to the fork of the 3rd branch thence up the fork to a persimmon tree or of Wm. B. B. thence along a line of marker trees to the first station
