# This Indenture

Made this  
 sixth day of February in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand  
 eight hundred and nineteen between Eliza S<sup>r</sup>ry & Polly S<sup>r</sup>ry  
 his wife of the County of Southampton and English of Nettleton  
 of this and part of Diza Heathill of the County Parish &  
 of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Eliza S<sup>r</sup>ry and  
 Polly his wife for and in consideration of the full and just sum  
 of fifty three dollars current money of Virginia to the said  
 Diza Heathill to them in hand paid at or before the executing  
 and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Eliza  
 S<sup>r</sup>ry and Polly S<sup>r</sup>ry his wife doth hereby acknowledge and  
 binden acquit and discharge the said Diza Heathill her  
 heirs and assigns forever and thenceforth through all  
 entirety of his contents and have granted bargained  
 sold aliened, released and confirmed and by these presents do  
 grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff and entitle n<sup>o</sup> man or woman  
 delivery and confirm unto her the said Diza Heathill and  
 to her heirs and assigns forever all that plantation messay  
 tract and parcel of land which he bought of Amos S<sup>r</sup>ry  
 situated lying and being in the parish of Nettleton County  
 of Southampton formerly containing by estimation twenty one  
 acres by the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit  
 Beginning at a red oak a corner in Thomas Lee thence along  
 a line of matted trees a pine a corner tree in Scotts line  
 thence along a line of matted trees to the branch thence  
 down the run of the branch to the fork of the 1<sup>st</sup> branch  
 thence up the fork to a persimmon tree over of Atlas Oak  
 thence along a line of matted trees to the first station
