This Indenture made this 15th day of March 1819 Between Charles Simmons & Hannah his wife of the one part & Thomas Simmons of the other part, all of the County of S.ampson of the Witneses that the said Charles Simmons & Hannah his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand eight hundred and forty two dollars to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Simmons & to his heirs & assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land, containing by estimation two hundred and fifty acres, but the same more or less, it being a part of the gift of land whereon my father the said Simmons formerly resided, reference being had to the commissioners report for the division of said land. The boundaries will
