This Indenture made this 22nd day of January in the
year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and nineteen
between Isham Pearson of the County of Pamptown and State of
Virginia and parish of Saint Luke of the one part and Thomas Pearson
of the same State County and parish of the other part (Pamptown) that the said
Isham Pearson for and in consideration of the sum of thirty one
Dollars and fifty cents good and lawful money of Va to him in
hand paid by the said Thomas Pearson the receipt whereof the said
Isham Pearson doth fully acknowledge himself fully and amply
satisfied and paid hath granted bargained sold alien
enfeoffed and confirmed unto the said Thomas Pearson to him and to
his heirs forever one certain tract or parcel of land situate
situate lying and being in the County and parish aforesaid and
adjoining along the side of the said Thomas Pearson's mill containing
by a late survey made by the City Surveyor of Pamptown City
thereabout seven and one half acres bounded as follows to wit
Beginning at a small gully a corner of Thomas Pearson standing
in a small branch running thence N 74 E 128 pole to the run of
Thomas Pearson's mill then up the run of the stream
for 6 pole to a corner of Isham Pearson's land on the side
of the run of stream thence N 74 E 128 pole to a new oak a new corner
mark in the same branch so started from thence along the said
branch 14 pole to the first station together making
