This Indenture made this 1st day of December in the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen between Thomas
 D. Riddle and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Granville State of
 North Carolina of the one part and James Tregant of the County of
 Southampton and State of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that
 the said Thomas D. Riddle and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration
 of the sum of Three hundred and ninety two dollars to them in hand
 paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged unto the said James
 Tregant his heirs executors and administrators forever acquitted and
 discharge of the same have granted bargained sold aliened, infess-
 ed and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain, sell,
 alien, infess and confirm unto the said James Tregant a certain
 lot and parcel and tract of land, situated, lying and being in
 the south side of Roanoke River in the County of Sampson aforesaid
 near the Town of Sausalum which said piece, lot parcel or tract of
 land was allotted to the above mentioned Elizabeth formerly Elizabeth
 Blunt one of the devisees of Benjamin Edwards dec'd by a decree
 of the late High Court of Chancery in the City of Richmond, and
 is described and known as lot no four in the report of the
 Commissioners who divided the lands of Benjamin Edwards dec'd and
 is bounded as follows (viz) Beginning at a white oak tree in
 Samuel Styles deceased line, a corner of lot no three, thence along
 the said Styles line to a pine tree thence north fifty degrees east
 to a birch sapling on the side of Edwards Creek thence down said
 creek to Roanoke river, then down said river to ^{the line of} lot no three
 then along that line to the beginning together with all ways
 moods, waters and natural and profits, commodities hereditaments
 and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land premises
