This Indenture made this 2^d day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen Jordan Beale agent for the Widow of the one part and Thomas Pond of the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Witnesseth that the said Jordan Beale for and in Consideration of the sum of seventy eight Dollars good and lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Pond at witness the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Jordan Beale doth hereby acknowledge himself fully satisfied & paid hath granted bargained, sold, aliened, released and conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Pond his heirs & assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land containing by estimation one hundred and sixty acres be the same more or less it being the 1/4 of Section thirteen of Township two, South in range seven west in the tract appropriated for military bounty in the territory of Illinois. To have and to hold the said Quarter section of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Thomas Pond and to his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Jordan Beale doth for himself his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, doth hereby covenant and promise, and grant to and with the said Thomas Pond his heirs and assigns shall any time warrant & forever defend the said tract or parcel of land unto the said Thomas Pond against the title, claim, or demand of any other person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part thereof In Witness whereof the said Jordan Beale hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and date above written
