This Indenture made this 28<sup>th</sup> day of May one thousand eight hundred and nineteen between Elisha Darden & wife his  
wife of the one part and Henry Gardner of the other part, all of the County of Hampton  
Frontiers State of Virginia witnesseth that the said Elisha Darden & wife  
Henry Gardner his wife for and consideration of the sum of one hundred and seventy  
four dollars to them in hand paid by the said Henry Gardner at before  
the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof his  
husband acknowledge<sup>d</sup> hath and doth acknowledge<sup>d</sup> bargained and sold  
Henry Gardner his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of  
land lying on the north side of the road leading from Ruthsby  
to Monroe formerly called the Browns Ferry Road Beginning at a  
maple standing near the said road in the upper swamp a corner  
of Richmond Dillards due Sip<sup>r</sup> Parkers farm Elisha Darden  
saford and thence along the said road N 52 W 10 poles then S 86 W 22  
poles then N 63 E 10 poles then N 49 W 32 poles then S 67 W 46  
poles then N 66 W 42 poles then N 34 W 14 poles then N 64  
W 62 poles to a black gum standing in or at road in the  
great slush thence having the said road N 20 E 30 poles to a poplar  
thence N 43 E 14 poles to a black gum thence S 30 E 19 poles to a  
black gum thence S 79 E 70 poles to a large pine and 15 poles  
more to an ash corner on Henry Gardner thence S 40 E 11 poles  
to a black gum corner on Henry Gardner & Richmond Dillards
