that John L. Taylor Esquire before whom the execution of the within  
deed, to which this testimonial is annexed was acknowledged, is now  
and was at that time, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of this  
State, and that full faith and credit are due and ought to be given  
to his official acts as such. In testimony whereof his Excellency  
John Branch Esquire Governor of the State of North Carolina, has  
caused the great seal of the said State to be affixed to these presents  
and signed the same at Raleigh this 19<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year  
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen and XLIV year

At a Court held for the County of Pamlico the 21<sup>st</sup> day of  
December 1819 This Indenture together with the Certificate of  
John L. Taylor Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of North Carolina

the privy examination of Mrs Julia Dunn, also the Certificate of  
John Branch Governor of North Carolina certifying that Jno L  
Taylor was at that time Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of  
North Carolina were this day returned and ordered to be recorded
