This Indenture

God one thousand eight hundred and nineteen between John Norworthy son of the first part William Briggs of the second part and Henry Briggs of the third part Witnesses that whereas the said John Norworthy doth justly to be paid on the 25th December next as by a bill bearing date the 30th of March 1819 more fully appears which debt with legal interest the said John Norworthy is willing and desirous to secure, Now this Indenture further consideration of one dollar to the said John Norworthy for in hand paid by the said William Briggs at or before the sealing & delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said John Norworthy hath bargained and sold, pleased and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell release and confirm unto the said William Briggs his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever the following property to wit, one sorrell mare, three heads of cattle, three sheep, two feather beds and furniture, one blk walnut desk sep black walnut chair two sons and eleven pigs, one saddle and bridle the crop of all kinds which shall be made on my plantation this year. upon trust nevertheless that the said William Briggs his executors administrators heirs and assigns shall permit the said John Norworthy to remain in quiet possession of the said property until default be made in the payment of the said sum either in whole or in part and then upon this special trust that the said William Briggs his heirs executors and assigns shall and will so soon after the happening of such default as the said Henry Briggs his heirs executors assigns or assigns shall direct or the said John Norworthy shall request sell to the highest bidder for ready money the above property or so much thereof as shall be sufficient to satisfy the said sum of fifty seven dollars and fifty cents with legal interest on the same or such part thereof as shall remain unpaid together with such other expenses as may be necessarily incurred in carrying this Indenture into effect and out of the monies arising from such sale pay to the said Henry Briggs his heirs executors assigns or assigns the said sum of fifty seven dollars and fifty cents with legal interest on the same or such part thereof as shall remain unpaid and pay the residue if any to the said John Norworthy his heirs executors and assigns but if the said sum of fifty seven dollars and fifty cents with legal interest should be fully paid off to the said Henry Briggs his heirs assigns or assigns on or before the 25th day of December next when the same is payable so that no default is made in the said payment then this Indenture to be void and to remain in full force and virtue.
