This Indenture made this tenth day of Decr in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & nineteen between William Suckins (and Peggy his wife of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the one part) and Alfred Brittle of the same County of the other part. Witnesseth that the said William Suckins and Peggy his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and thirty six dollars & 25 cts lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Alfred Brittle the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Alfred Brittle his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded by the lands of the said Alfred Brittle William Suckins' other land George Washington and Drucilla M. B. Brittle (it being a part of the tract which Jordan Suckins once occupied on the Tarras Swamp) containing by a late survey twenty seven and a quarter acres be the same more or less. To have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances unto the said Alfred Brittle his heirs and assigns, to the only proper use and behoof of the said Alfred Brittle his heirs and assigns forever. and the said William Suckins and Peggy his wife do covenant and agree to and with the said Alfred Brittle, that they
