This Indenture made this second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty between John Vick and wife Polly and Edwin Vick of the parish of Nottoway and County of Sampson of the one part, and Jesse Vick of the said parish and County of the other part, Witnesseth that he the said John Vick and Polly his wife and Edwin Vick for and in consideration of the sum of thirty pounds, current money of Virginia to them in hand paid but in before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof them said John Vick and wife and Edwin Vick doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said Jesse Vick his heirs executors and assigns by these presents, them the said John Vick and wife and Edwin Vick hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Jesse Vick and to his heirs or assigns forever one certain tract or parcels of land (if it undivided between the heirs of Joseph Vick) it being each of our one sixth part of the land and plantation called Roastin which the said Mary Roastin, wife of Joseph Vick, lying and being in the parish of said county aforesaid, containing by estimation with the houses, ways, water courses, profits, commodities hereditaments and
