I James Harris of the County of Southampton for and in consid-
eration of the natural love and affection which I bear to my
Daughter Edith Harris of said County as well as for the further
consideration of one dollar to me in hand paid by the
said Edith Harris at or before the sealing & delivery of
these the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath given
granted and by these presents do give, grant unto the said
Edith Harris her exors, admors and assigns the following
slaves to wit my negro man called Little Jacob a black-
smith also my negro boy called Isham and my negro woman
called Fender and my negro girl called Winny also my negu
boy called Myatt. I have and to hold the said negroes unto
her the said Edith Harris her exors, admors and assigns forever
and the said James Harris for himself his exors, admors the said
slaves unto the said Edith Harris her exors, admors, assigns
against the claim of him the said James Harris his exors
and admors and against the claim of every other person
whatever shall and law warrant and force defend by
these presents. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this sixth day of January one thousand
eight hundred and twenty
