This Indenture made and entered into this 16th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen by and between Henry Welsh of the county of Stampton in the state of Virginia of the first part and Edmund Vick of the same County and state of the second part and Edmund Thorp of the same County and state of the third part whereas the said Henry Welsh stands justly indebted to the said Edmund Thorp in the sum of three hundred and three dollars and 45 cents by bond bearing date with this Indenture payable on demand the payment of which together with the interest which may accrue thereon the said Henry Welsh is willing and desirous to assure and secure to the said Edmund Thorp now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that the said Henry Welsh as well in consideration of the premises as of the sum of one dollar current money of the United States to him in hand paid by the said Edmund Vick at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the full receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged first from every part of which the said Henry Welsh and all his legal representatives are forever exonerated and discharged have granted bargained and sold and do hereby grant bargain and sell unto the said Edmund Vick his heirs as follows that is to say the said Henry Welsh have granted bargained and sold and do hereby grant bargain and sell unto the said Edmund Vick his heirs and assigns one certain parcel or tract of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County and state contain by a late Survey made by James Jones Surveyor for said County one hundred and two acres it being the same
